

## **Information on Composts**

### **Dalefoot Composts**

Potash rich bracken forms the base for all these composts. Herdwick Sheep's wool is blended into all the Wool Composts for improved water retention and slow release nitrogen. These composts are completely PEAT FREE and are not made from green waste.

### **Lakeland Gold**

Traditional claybuster and autumn mulch. Encourages worms and enriches your soil.

- Mulch into your beds in Autumn for improved nutrition and added moisture retention
- Top dress plants such as potatoes, fruit trees, asparagus and flowering shrubs (1 bag per m<sup>2</sup>)

### **Wool Compost**

For growing in containers where water retention is key. No need to add extra feed or water retaining gels.

- Use in containers, hanging baskets and raised beds

### **Wool Seed Compost**

A blended, fine mix to provide a good start for your seeds.

- Healthy green seedlings from a gentle feed
- Once roots develop, transfer to Wool Compost.

### **Wool Compost for Vegetables and Salad**

For "grow your own" vegetables, salad and fruit in an allotment, raised beds, containers or windowsill.

- Up to 50% less watering
- Feeds throughout the growing season

### **Other Peat-Free Composts**

#### **Melcourt Sylvagrow Compost**

100% peat-free compost - suitable for a wide range of garden applications including potting-on, planting out and as a growing bag. RHS recommended.

#### **Tomorite Peat-free Grow Bag**

Extra-large peat free organic planter enriched with Tomorite. Perfect for fruit and vegetables such as tomatoes, peppers, aubergines, melons, courgette, marrows, and cucumbers.

#### **Rocket Gro Peat-Free Compost**

This is a peat-free, all-round compost, which can be used around the garden, for planting out, topping up beds and borders, filling pots, veg beds and containers and for planting out fruit trees. This compost blend has two sources of feed. An upfront 12-week feed from two organic fertilisers and a slower release feed from the digestate fibre in the compost which lasts at least 3 months.
